ONE SEED GREAT HARVEST

In 1921 two young missionary couples left Sweden for the Belgian Congo (now Zaire), David and Seva Flood and the Ericson family.

After arriving at the main missionary station they decided to take the gospel to a remote area.

They went to the village of N'Dolera but the chief of the village did not want them there for fear of turning the villagers from their local gods.

They prayed for a spiritual breakthrough but there was none. The only contact was a small boy from the village who brought eggs and chickens twice a week.



Seva Flood, a tiny woman of 4' 8" decided if this was the only African she could talk to, she would try and lead this boy to Jesus and she did.

Malaria continued to strike one member after another and the Erickson family left and went back to the main mission station.

Then Seva Flood found herself pregnant in the middle of the primitive wilderness. However she was weak because

of the malaria and delivered a little girl and then she died seventeen days later and the baby girl was named Aina.

Inside David Flood something snapped in that moment. So he dug a crude grave and buried his 27 year old wife and then went down to the main mission station. There he gave his little girl to the Erickson family to raise and he got on a boat back to Sweden a bitter and broken man who now hated God.

Eight months later both of the Erikson's died of malaria and the little girl was given to an American missionary couple. She was then taken back to America and raised in South Dakota and her name was changed to Aggie.

The American couple was afraid to return to Africa because of legal difficulties and switched from being missionaries to being a pastor.

Aggie grew up in South Dakota and as a young woman she attended North Central Bible College in Minneapolis. There she met and married a young man named Dewey Hurst. The Hurst's had a successful ministry and they had two children.

In time her husband became the President of a Christian College in Seattle, Washington.

Aggie was surprised to find so much of the Scandinavian



heritage in that area. One day a Swedish religious magazine appeared in her mailbox. She had no idea who sent it and of course she couldn't read

the words, but as she turned the pages...all of a sudden a photo stopped her cold.

There in a primitive setting was a grave with a white cross...on the cross were the words "Seva Flood". Aggie jumped in her car and went to a college professor who she knew could translate the article.

The instructor summarized the story...it was about missionaries that came to D'Dolera along time ago...the birth of a white baby...the death of the young mother...and the one little African boy who had been led to Christ, and how after the whites had left the boy grew up and finally persuaded the chief to let him build a school in the village.

The article said that he gradually won all his students to Christ and the children led their parents to Christ and even the chief became a Christian.

Today there are six hundred Christian believers in that one village, all because of the sacrifice of David and Seva


Flood.

For there 25th wedding anniversary the college gave the Hurst's a trip to Sweden. There Aggie sought to find her father. He was an old man now and he had re-married and had four children and became an alcoholic. He had recently suffered a stroke and he was still bitter and angry at God.

He had one rule for his family "never mention God's name" because God took everything from me!

Aggie found her father and got to meet her step brothers and sisters and they advised her not to bring up God when she met her father.

Aggie walked into the apartment room with liquor bottles everywhere and saw her father on a messed up



bed....Papa she said. He turned and began to cry, Aina I never meant to give you away.

It's all right Papa. God took care of me! Her father stiffened and the tears stopped.

God forgot all of us. Our lives have been like this because of Him.

Papa I have a story to tell you and it is a true story.

You didn't go to Africa in vain. Mama didn't die in vain.

The little boy you won to the Lord grew up to win that whole village to Jesus Christ. The one seed that you planted just kept growing and growing.

Today there are 600 African

people serving the Lord because you were faithful to the call of God in your life. Papa Jesus loves you and He has never hated you. The old man gave his life back to Jesus and he died a few weeks after Aggie left him to return to America.

A few years later the Hurst's were attending a high-level evangelism conference in London, England when a report was given from the nation of Zaire (the former Belgian Congo).

The Superintendent of the National Church representing over 110,000 baptized believers spoke of the Gospels spread through his nation.

Aggie went up to him after the conference and asked him if he knew of her mother and father...David and Seva Flood.

He spoke French and his words were translated into English...It was Seva Flood who led me to Jesus. I was the boy who brought food to your parents before you were born. In fact, to this day your mother's grave and her memory are honored by all of us.

He embraced her and told her she must come to Africa to see because your mother is the most famous person in our history.

In time that's exactly what Aggie Hurst and her husband did. They were welcomed by cheering throngs of villagers. She even met the man who had been hired by her father many years before to carry her back down the mountain in a hammock-cradle.

The most dramatic moment came when the pastor escorted Aggie to her mother's grave to see the white cross for herself. She knelt in the soil to pray and

give thanks.

See what one seed that you plant as you witness for Christ can change a nation or a family!

THE FLIGHT OF GEESE

"Also in Judah the hand of God was on the people to give them unity of mind to carry out what the king and his officials had ordered, following the word of the Lord." - 2 Chronicles 30:12

A major corporation conducted a study on the flight of geese. In their study they found that geese fly in a "V" formation with one goose in the lead. After a period of time, this goose relinquishes the lead to another goose. During flight they noticed head movements of the leader that seem to give signals to the other geese flying, perhaps to let the others know how he was doing. They estimate that the formation flight pattern reduces wind drag due to the lift the other birds receive and believe it increases their performance by up to 70 percent. Whenever one goose drops out, another goes with it. These two geese do not catch up to the original pack, but join another group later.

Independence is one of the strongholds of the workplace. The entire system feeds the desire within us to gain recognition from our individual achievements. We wrongly believe financial independence frees us from needing to de-



pend on anyone else. The fact is dependence on others is a good thing. It can bring us into a unity of spirit that accomplishes much more with less effort while meeting needs for each of us. Christ talked a lot about unity among brothers and sisters. He said that others would know we are Christians by our love for one another and by our unity. We need to depend on others so that we don't go it alone. By walking together we increase our strength. By going it alone we must carry a load we were never intended to carry. God did not create us to go it alone. By joining together we accomplish more for Jesus Christ. Ask the Lord today if there is an independent spirit within you that prevents you from joining others in the mission He has called you to.
